DECATUR – To honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, the DeKalb County Drug Court (DCDC) will join other Community members in the spirit of giving back.

The Martin Luther King Jr. Service Project is a volunteer home repair program that enables lower-income senior homeowners to remain in their homes safely, comfortably and affordably. The Drug Court participants have volunteered over the last few years to honor their commitment to Dr. King and their community.

The DCDC is a judicially supervised treatment approach that serves as an alternative to incarceration for non-violent offenders whose criminal behavior has been driven by drug addiction. The DCDC work with numerous community partners in efforts to create positive social and outreach opportunities as a way of giving back.

The MLK Service Project will take place this Saturday, Sunday, and Monday at the Community Center of South Decatur, in the Oakhurst section of the city.
